Milepost 309 Connecting the Dots, Again

The four-part Ruth series, is designed to invite serious reflection by individuals for our own lives, and for the congregation as a whole. It's preparation for vision work, which begins Sept. 25.

Orpah's story communicated: Joining in what God is doing requires leaving our comfort zone. New vision (direction) for Crest Manor will require most (or all) of us to leave our personal comfort zone, and for the congregation to leave its comfort zone. The alternative, which we are free to choose, is continued decline.

Naomi's story communicated: Being emotionally honest in relating to our brothers and sisters, contributes to our individual and corporate wellbeing (salvation.) While vision work includes cognitive work, i.e. sharing our thoughts and perspectives with each other, such work must also include being emotionally honest in these conversations. It is not hyperbole to say this vision process is about matters of life and death.

Boaz' story communicated: Accountability, humility, and putting the community's wellbeing ahead of our own, enables us to do the right thing when we discover what God is doing among us. We won't come up with an excuse, as Boaz' cousin did. We will recognize we have things to learn which will change our methods and priorities our direction.

Ruth's story communicated: We are called to go far beyond welcoming and caring for the "outsider." We will realize how much we have to learn from them, because if we look through the surface stuff, we discover that they understand things about God, which we do not.

Let's continue to bathe this vision process in prayer, so that the Holy Spirit moves among us providing Wisdom and encouragement as we work together - Gary Martin

New Community Project 2022 Program Highlights

Thank you, Crest Manor, for your ongoing support of the ministries of New Community Project – where would we be without you?!

One of the things your support makes possible are our efforts to empower women and educate girls in our partner areas: Myanmar, South Sudan, Rwanda, Congo, Malawi, and Nepal. From scholarships and hostels and sanitary materials for girls to microloans and training programs for women, we're doing whatever we can to give these sisters a better chance for a better life two hour Give a Girl a Chance program.

One recent highlight has been to begin supporting Chepang hilltribe girls in southern Nepal. When we met them this past year in a mountain community, the five girls graduating from 5^{th} grade had nowhere to go – the next level of education was in the valley below and beyond their reach financially. One consequence of this would have been the very real prospect of early marriage – as young as 13 or 14 years old, or the possibility of being trafficked to India next door. We put this out to our network, and along with some of our existing funds, and came up with the \$20 per girl per month it will take to keep them on a path to a brighter future. Speaking of which, they do their part – walking an hour down the mountain path in the morning, and longer than that back up after school.
