To Prepare for Sunday

To prepare for worship:

Isaiah's prophesy (Is. 60), is good news for a discouraged Israel. The listener has only two things to do: stand up, and look around at what God is doing. The rest of the action is done by God. Israel was sitting in the rubble, and could not see what God was doing. Standing up requires changing our position. Getting out of our comfort zone enables us to see what God is doing. The story of the magi (Mt 2), revealed that Jesus came for the world, not just Israel. Please re-read our new vision, and reflect on a specific area in which you feel God's call to stand up.

Transition Update: We celebrate the congregation's approval of the proposed Vision Statement last Sunday. Some objectives will be pursued immediately. **Please read the Herald faithfully each week, since it is the primary source for vision implementation information.**

The last step in the Transition Process is evaluating the organizational structure, in light of the new vision: will it help or hinder vision achievement? "Structure" refers to all decision-making groups and committees—and how individuals are selected for these roles, as well as forum, and how pastoral leadership fits into the structure. Leadership Team has appointed a Structural Evaluation Task Group. It meets on January 16, and will report its initial findings to Leadership Team and the Congregation by the end of February. It will likely have information to report at the next Forum, on February 4.) Please support the work of the Task Group, in prayer.

Anabaptism turns 500 in 2025. A first-ever Anabaptist bible is being produced, which is described as "an approach to Scripture that is Jesus-centered, interpreted together, and transforms our lives." The five hundredth anniversary in 2025 gives the church a unique opportunity to celebrate and dream. Milepost 442 Hearing, or Using God's Word

One of the issues Jonah had with the Lord, was the Lord's (spoken) Word. Jonah thought the Lord's Word should conform to Jonah's beliefs. If God's Word always supports our beliefs, we are *using* God's Word, instead of *hearing* God's Word. Ironically, the sailors and people of Nineveh, *heard* God's Word through God's Prophet Jonah, who himself, refused to *hear* God's Word.

One of the characteristics I admire in Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was his unapologetic integration of his Christian faith based in God's Word, with his political agenda. His calls for civil rights, justice for those on the margins of society, and an end to the Vietnam War, were consistently grounded in his faith and God's Word.

In King's *I have a dream* speech (Aug 28, 1963, Washington, DC), he appealed to the OT prophets Amos (5:24), *But let justice roll down...*, and Isaiah (40:4-5), *Every valley shall be exalted...*. He encouraged his listeners by quoting Psalm 30:5, *weeping may stay for the night, but rejoicing comes in the morning*. The gospel came through clearly in Galatians 3:28, *There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus*.

As Christians, I believe it is both possible and necessary, for our justice efforts to be grounded in the good news of God's Kingdom, as revealed in Jesus. It can be done in a way that is both effective, and at the same time respectful of other faith traditions. Jesus demonstrated that way, which has little, if anything, in common with what most Christians associate with evangelism today.

The third priority in our new Vision is: *Trusting God's grace* and the Spirit's leading each day, the Crest Manor congregation extends a shalom presence, shaped by our Anabaptist/Pietist understanding of the Gospel, in our local and global neighborhoods.

Let's *listen to the word that God has spoken*, and hear even greater clarity for living into the new direction.
